Managing White House Records

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Session:

This session will focus on the unique challenges of managing White House records. It will touch upon the changes in records over the past 28 years, presidential transitions, Presidential records Act and what happens to the records once a president leaves office.

Bio:

Philip Droege currently serves as the Director of the White House Office of Records Management. He grew up in the Maryland suburbs of Washington, DC and graduated from Concordia College in Seward, Nebraska in 1989. Mr. Droege started his professional life as a high school teacher on Long Island, New York. In July of 1990 he moved back to Washington, DC to take a job in the White House as a Records Technician. During his 28 years in the Office of Records Management, he has served in five Presidential Administrations as a Records Analyst, Supervisor, Deputy Director and his current position as Director, which he has held since 2004.
